Full Time

Canadian Mennonite University invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track faculty position in **Biology**. The successful candidate will work with other faculty to help build a vigorous and growing undergraduate science program, which is an integral part of all our undergraduate degree paths. We seek individuals who love to teach in the classroom and laboratory. Welcome areas of specialization include ecology (pure or applied), systematics, evolutionary biology, organismal biology (of any taxonomic group) or integrative physiology. Strong candidates with backgrounds in cellular or molecular biology will also be given serious consideration.

CMU is a liberal arts university rooted in the Anabaptist tradition of Christianity, committed to educating for peace and justice, learning through thinking *and* doing, fostering dialogue among all peoples, and modeling invitational community. The University engages faculty to teach and pursue scholarship within that framework. Applicants should hold a PhD or be near completion of their doctorate, have a strong record of scholarly research, and a demonstrated commitment to excellence in teaching. Postdoctoral research experience is an asset, but not essential.

Interested candidates should submit: a letter of application; a statement of teaching philosophy; a curriculum vitae; a two-page statement on how their faith commitment would contribute to teaching and scholarship at CMU; evidence of teaching effectiveness; and contact information for three references. Subject to final budgetary approval, the appointment will begin July 1, 2015. Rank will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Review of applications will begin December 1, 2014, and will continue until the position is filled.

Winnipeg (population 700,000) is a vibrant, diverse city, the capital of Manitoba, and the cultural heart of Canada's prairie provinces. Well known for its literary, musical and artistic scene, it is also home to four universities and several federal laboratories. CMU's Shaftesbury campus includes a small farm, borders the Assiniboine Forest, one of North America's largest urban forests, and is nearby the 450 ha (1,100 acre) Assiniboine Park, which includes the Assiniboine Park Zoo and Botanical Conservatory.
