Faculty Position – Music
Full Time
Emphasis: Voice Performance

The School of Music at Canadian Mennonite University invites applications for a full-time position in **Music** at the rank of Assistant Professor, for an initial three-year tenure-track appointment beginning in July 2015. This appointment will emphasize voice performance with the possibility for complementary areas such as choral performance, music theory, and music education. The appointment is subject to final budgetary approval.

CMU is a liberal arts university rooted in the Anabaptist tradition of Christianity, and engages faculty to teach and pursue scholarship within that framework.

Candidates should hold a Ph.D. in Music or D.M.A. in Music Performance; ABD applicants will be considered. Evidence of scholarly/professional performance activity is required, and the candidate must also demonstrate evidence of successful teaching and a commitment to artistic and professional growth.

The position will involve teaching undergraduate music courses (including music theory), individual applied music studies, and other responsibilities according to the successful applicant's areas of expertise and the needs of the department. The position includes research/performance and service components, as with other academic appointments at CMU. Candidates will be asked to include a performance and teaching demonstration as part of the selection process. Additional strengths in at least one of the following areas are desired: theory pedagogy, music technology, choral performance, and music education.

Review of applications will begin immediately, and will continue until the position is filled. Interested candidates should submit a letter of application, including a statement on how the candidate can advance the mission of CMU and how their faith commitment would contribute to teaching and scholarship/performance at CMU, a statement of teaching philosophy, curriculum vitae, evidence of performance expertise and teaching effectiveness, and contact information for three references.

Evidence of performance expertise teaching effectiveness may include the following:

- evaluations from supervisors, peers and/or students; performance reviews/critiques
- course materials including selected syllabi and representative assignments
- DVD recording of classroom or studio teaching
- CD or DVD of recorded performance
