Full Time

Canadian Mennonite University invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track faculty position in **Psychology**. We seek individuals who have the capacity to help to build an exciting and growing Psychology program, while contributing complementary strengths to interdisciplinary programs. Welcome areas of specialization include, but are not limited to, community psychology, cultural psychology, trauma healing, clinical/counseling psychology, or developmental psychology.

CMU is a liberal arts university rooted in the Anabaptist tradition of Christianity, and engages faculty to teach and pursue scholarship within that framework. Applicants should hold a PhD or be near completion of their doctorate, have a solid theoretical and methodological background, a strong record of scholarly research, and a demonstrated commitment to excellence in teaching.

Interested candidates should submit: a letter of application; a curriculum vitae; and contact information for three referees who have agreed to provide letters of recommendation and respond to questions from the search committee if requested. A short list of candidates will be asked to provide three letters of recommendation and substantial documentation of teaching effectiveness, research and service, along with statements on teaching philosophy and on how their faith commitment would contribute to teaching and scholarship at CMU. These candidates may be contacted for preliminary telephone or in-person interviews with members of the search committee, and they may also be asked to provide the names and contact information of additional referees to be contacted by the search committee. Some candidates may be invited to campus beginning in January 2015 for interviews and presentations to classes and various groups.

Subject to final budgetary approval, the appointment will begin July 1, 2015. Rank will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Review of applications will begin December 1, 2014 but applications submitted up to January 15, 2015 will also be considered.
