In small classes, we build mentoring relationships with students. We value teaching breadth and would welcome contributions in specializations including many foundational areas of Psychology: Introductory courses, Research Methods, Social Psychology, Cognitive Processes, Neuropsychology, and/or Health Psychology.

CMU is a Christian liberal arts university rooted in the Mennonite tradition. We expect faculty, in their teaching, research, and service, to engage productively and critically with the intellectual and spiritual life of the campus community.
