We are seeking an individual who loves laboratory work, collaborates effectively and enthusiastically with students and colleagues, and actively pursues opportunities to develop and refine their skills.

The successful candidate will have a thorough grounding in biological and chemical laboratory techniques and will take on the following duties (we will actively support training opportunities in areas where the candidate has less experience, as required):

Administrative

- Manage lab budget, ordering laboratory equipment and supplies as required
- Overseeing the maintenance of laboratory equipment
- Updating and maintaining inventories of materials and chemicals
- Ensuring compliance with biological and chemical safety regulations and standards
- Supervising undergraduate lab assistants

Laboratory Preparation

- Preparation of equipment, media, and solutions in advance of laboratory classes
- Overseeing proper use and readiness of laboratory facilities (The courses associated with the laboratory include Intro Chemistry, Organic Chemistry, Biochemistry, Intro Biology, Genetics, and Cell Biology)

Opportunities for laboratory teaching may also be part of the job portfolio, depending on candidate strengths and program needs. Applicants should hold a masters degree or have equivalent laboratory experience.
