BA with a Social Science Major Why major in Social Science at CMU?

The Social Science major helps students access the wide range of the Social Sciences in order to develop the ability to critically analyze and synthesize material into interdisciplinary questions on citizenship, multicultural understanding, and community. Students may choose to focus on one of the concentrations listed below, or they may choose to create their own concentration by blending courses that focuses on a theme.

This degree highlights the strength of CMU's offerings in the Social Sciences – Economics, Geography, History, International Development Studies, Peace & Conflict Transformation Studies, Political Studies, Psychology, and Sociology – and experience-based learning through practicum opportunities.

Social Science Concentrations

Counselling Studies: Prepare for further professional study in counselling or therapy; develop communication skills for personal and workplace relationships; enhance knowledge of counselling techniques and theories used in therapeutic practice, clinical and pastoral settings.

Intercultural Studies: Increase intercultural competencies and sensitivities; develop knowledge of the psychosocial and historical role of culture in change, politics, creative expression, identity, and conflict; critically engage questions of transnational populations, population displacement, and statelessness.

Social Service: Acquire knowledge and skills required for future work in a range of public and non-profit organizations; understand theories and principles related to the effective delivery of social services; gain analytical abilities on peace and justice-oriented approaches to social services; prepare for further professional programs.
